



After Your Injection

- 1) Your eye may be red and swollen, possibly with mild bloody tears.
- 2) Your eye may burn or feel irritated and scratchy, particularly for the first 1-2 days after the injection.
- 3) You may notice new “floaters” in your vision, usually black “specks” or “bubbles.” These will typically disappear in a day or two.
- 4) The goal of treatment is to prevent vision loss, but many patients will notice some improvement in vision. Visual improvement typically occurs gradually over the two or three weeks following the injection.
- 5) Use the antibiotic drop prescribed by your doctor **3 times per day for 3 days.**
- 6) You may use artificial tears as often as needed to relieve irritation and scratchiness.
- 7) Call our office immediately for increasing pain or decreasing vision, or for any questions you may have.
